Scrum Roles

A Scrum team is a group of Developers, a Product Owner, and a Scrum Master who work together on one goal, the Product Goal, without any divisions or rankings. The Scrum Team handles all aspects of the product, works at a steady speed, and produces a useful Increment every Sprint, with clear roles for each member.

Role	Accountable for	Responsibilities
Developers	Creating any aspect of a usable Increment each Sprint	Creates plan for Sprint, adapting to changes and adhering to the Definition of Done (D.O.D)
Product Owner	Maximizing the value of the product resulting from the work of the Scrum Team	Manages all parts of the Product Backlog, represents the stakeholders in discussions and typically has extensive knowledge of the product
Scrum Master	Establishing Scrum as defined in the Scrum Guide	Serves the team and helps everyone understand Scrum framework and removes impediments and blockers for the team
